Meeting Rules of Order September 21, 2023 Strathcona BIA Annual General Meeting

- 1. The Annual General Meeting of the Strathcona BIA will be run in accordance with its bylaws and these Standing Rules. In the event of a dispute not covered by these Standing Rules, the dispute shall be conducted in accordance with the provisions of Robert's Rule of Order, unless modified by the *Societies Act* or the bylaws.
- 2. The Chair will confirm there is quorum at the beginning of the meeting.
- 3. The meeting is only for the purpose of transacting the business set out in the agenda. Issues of a personal nature will not be debated or considered.
- 4. All speakers will practice fairness and be courteous and respectful in their communication at all times.
- 5. A person who wishes to speak will do so after being recognized by the chair.
- 6. Discussion, comments, or questions must be related to the pending motion or report.
- 7. Discussion shall be limited to three minutes for each speaker.
- 8. A member is allowed to address the Chair twice per agenda item.
- 9. One speaker is allowed at a time.
- 10. A motion must be seconded before it can be discussed.
- 11. A motion passes with a majority of voting members present (50% plus 1)
- 12. Discussion/debate on a motion may be closed by general consent, or by a motion to close debate. Such a motion is not debatable, and must be approved by a 2/3 majority.
- 13. A meeting can be adjourned or terminated by ordinary resolution. A motion to adjourn is always in order and is not debatable.
