## Strathcona BIA Board of Directors Election 2023

Members in good standing of the Society of the Strathcona Business Improvement Association (SBIA) are invited to review the five incumbent candidates and three new candidates up for election for the Board of Directors at the 2023 Annual General Meeting (AGM).

Every year, the board reviews the existing collective skills, attributes and experience of its directors to identify gaps or priorities, as informed by the SBIA's strategic vision and goals. This is to ensure an optional board governance structure is in place to effectively guide the organization.

As part of the 2023 Call for Nominations process, the SBIA received eight completed nomination packages. At the 2023 AGM members will vote on how many seats will be assigned to the board for the ensuing year. Your Board of Directors is proposing that the board size be set at 12 seats for the ensuing year. If passed the eight candidates up for election would all join the board via acclimation. As per the SBIA bylaws, the Board of Directors can have as few as 8 seats and as many as 12 seats.
